# Descendants of David Tibbals

DAVID<sup>5</sup> TIBBALS (DAVID THOMPSON<sup>4</sup>, ARNOLD<sup>3</sup>, THOMAS<sup>2</sup>, THOMAS<sup>1</sup> TIBBOLES) was born 8 Oct 1785 in Milford, Hartford, CT, and died 27 Sep 1868 in Canadice, Ontario, NY. He married (1) UNKNOWN (Source: 1788 History of Ontario County, New York, (Everts, Ensign & Everts: Phila, PA, 1876), Mother of one, Phebe.) Bef. 1809. She died 17 Sep 1809 in Saratoga Co., NY. He married (2) CHARLOTTE TABER Abt. 1812 in Scipio, Cayuga Co., NY, daughter of PARDON TABER and SUSANNAH. She was born Abt. 1793 in Berne, Albany, NY, and died 13 Apr 1832 in Canadice, Ontario, NY. He married (3) MRs. PHEBE (ALCOTT) BLACKMORE, CORNELL, KIMBALL 25 Jul 1832 in Canadice, Ontario, NY (Source: Ontario Phoenix, Canandaigua, NY July 25, 1832, In Canadice, on Sunday the 15th inst., by Jabez Ward, Esq., Mr. David Tibbals married Mrs. Phebe Kimball.). She was born Abt. 1785 in MA, and died 3 Apr 1864 in Canadice, Ontario, NY (Source: Probably buried in Tibbals Family Cemetery, across the road from her home. Gravestones destroyed over the years by vandals. Cemetery renewed in 2002.).

# Notes for DAVID TIBBALS:

David Tibbals, Canadice was born in Hartford Co., CT Oct. 8, 1785. When eight years old, his father moved to Galway, Saratoga County, NY. There he lived until manhood. He learned the carpenter and joiner's trade. married, moved to Cayuga Co., NY. there followed his profession for 10 years. In 1816 he bought a farm in Canadice, and in 1818, he moved to the farm in Canadice, Ontario Co., NY and lived there until his death which occured Sep 27, 1868. Mr. Tibbals was the husband of three wives, and the father of seven children. His first wife, was the mother of one (Phebe), died Sep 17, 1809, in Saratoga County. His second wife was the mother of six children (Sarah, Wakeman, Charlotte, Peter, Noah, and Luther). On Apr. 9, 1832, this wife and mother died a most pitiable death caused by falling on to a newly made fire in an old fashioned log house fireplace. Mr. Tibbals rose early on Sunday morning, built the fire as usual, and went to the barn to do some chores, expecting to return before any of the family were up. When he came in he found Mrs. Tibbals sitting on the foor with her flannel clothing all burned off one side of her, with the fragments of clothing and adhering coals scattered over the the floor. She lingered four days and expired. Mrs. Tibbals was an unfortunate woman from her youth, being troubled with epilepsy, which caused her premature death. Mr. Tibbals third consort died Apr. 3, 1864. Of the children of Mr. Tibbals, four are dead; Phebe, Sarah, Peter and Wakeman. Charlotte is unknown. Noah and Luther live in Canadice. Noah is on the homestead where he was born. (History of Ontario County, New York, ed George S. Conover, pub. by D. Mason &Co., Syracuse, NY, 1893, Family Sketches, p. 189)

09 Jul 1813, Deed, Scipio, Cayuga Co., NY between Joel Coe of the township of Scipio in the County of Cayuga and State of New York, and Hepzibah, his wife of the first part, and David Tibbals, of the township of Scipio aforesaid of the second part for the sum of \$300 to Joel Coe, all that certain piece of parcel of land being a part of Lot number 16 on the township of Scipio, beginning on the south line of said lot in the center of the road running from Joel Coes to Ezra Strongs where said road intersects the south line of said lot containing 10 acres and one half acre of land and 4 perches. Recorded 13 Feb 1816.

From CANADICE IN THE NEWS, Ontario County Times, Canandaigua, NY, Jun 14, 1876 from Canadice in the Early Days, Chapter XIV, p. 93, written by D. Byron Waite, Canadice resident): David Tibbals, from Scipio, took the place of Spicer in 1818, by purchase, lived and died there. He was a carpenter by trade, and was thrice married. The chldren were, Peter and Noah, who died in town; Charlotte, the wife of Wm. Edgar, who went to Wisconsin, and Luther who staid in town. No mention in this article about daughter, Phebe, who married Amaziah Sergeant and moved in the 1840s to Michigan and then to P.O. Mechanicsburg, Champaign Co., OH.

13 Sep 1841, Deed, between Ira Allen and Lucy, his wife of Richmond, Ontario Co., and State of NY of the first part and David Tibbals of Candice, Ontario Co., NY of the second part for \$527.40 to the first part, sold all that

certain tract or parcel of land in the Town of Canadice, being part of Lot number 7 and 9 of a tract of land called the Gibson Tract described in a deed dated 23 Aug 1825, executed by Henry B. Gibson and wife to the said David Tibbls and recorded in Ontario County Clerk's Office 4 Oct 1825 in Liber 44, folio 68, in township number 8, in the 5th range of township in County of Ontario, beginning on the highway running east and west on the corner being on the west line of lands of Edmond Pursel, running then south along said Purcels west line 121 rods and 15 links to the south line of said town of Canadice, containing 28 acres and 140 rods of land being part of a tract of land theretofore conveyed to the said part of the first part by Crayton Eldred on 29 May 1837, and recorded in the clerk's office on 1 Apr 1839 in Book 65 of deed page 305. Also, executed by Ira Allen and wife to the said David Tibbals, containing 28 acres and 124 rods, recorded in Ontario County Clerk's Office 7 Sep 1843 in Book 74, p. 366.

24 Sep 1867, Deed, Ontario Co., NY, Liber 141, p. 100 between David Tibbals, of first part, sold the family homestead, to son, Noah Tibbals, of the second part, both of Canadice for the sum of \$2000. Located in 5th range of township of Canadice, formerly Richmond, County of Ontario, State of NY, designated as Lot 8 in Samuel Lawrence Tract, containing 102 acres and 42 rods, same premesis named in a deed bearing date of 23 Aug 1825, executed by Henry B. Gibson and wife, Sarah, to the said David Tibbals for \$116.31, and recorded in Ontario Co., NY clerks office the 4 Oct 1825 in Liber 44, pages 68-69.

16 Jan 1868, Warranty Deed, David Tibbals to Noah Tibbals, Liber 141, p. 100:

From Sheffield W. Peabody's Diary, Oct 11, 1868 (Sunday). Old Mr. Tibbals had his funeral sermon preached at the meeting house.

Phebe Alcott's name does not appear in the indexes of births from 1630-1799 in the City of Boston, MA. Efforts to locate the names of her parents unsuccessful so far. Her original surname might have been spelled several ways: Alcox, Alcott, Allcott, Olcott, etc. The families changed the spelling in New England. Amos Bronson Alcott changed the spelling from Alcox to Alcott.

# Notes for WILLIAM EDGAR:

According to his obituary of William Edgar in the "Monticello Messenger" of 4 August 1904 " He emigrated to America at the age of 19 years and first settled in Livingston County, New York, where he was married seven. years later...In 1846 he came West and located at West Tray, Walworth County, this state [Wisconsin]. In the spring of 1847 he enlisted with Co.P, 73rd Wisconsin infantry and served his country gallantly during the Mexican war, being with Gen. Scott's command. Before his removal north, the deceased enjoyed the distinction of being the only survivor of the Mexican war in Green County. In 1840 Mr Edgar took advantage of the privilege offered by the government to soldiers and located 160 acres of land in Exeter township. This tract was later increased to 210 acres by purchase and it was here that the deceased made his home for a period of more than 45 years. During the summer of 1881 he enjoyed a sojourn of several months in his native land and upon his return to America he traveled considerably for a number of years. He spent some time at the National Soldiers' Home in Milwaukee not because of necessity, but because there was nothing that afforded him more keen enjoyment than the companionship of his old comrades. He was well known throughout Green County and was a familiar figure at all the gatherings of old soldiers ... After 52 years of wedded life, during which time she shared with him the trials and hardships of the early days, his devoted wife passed away in 1897 and since that time he has made his home for the most part with his two sons, Fred and Henry. Two years ago he removed from Monticello to River Falls, with his son Henry and family, with whom he resided until he answered the final call, which came on July 22nd...Thus we witness the passing of another of those sturdy pioneers whose life was so closely interwoven with the early history of the county and one who, upright and honourable in character, had always enjoyed the esteem of his fellow men."
