I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 90,953, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that George Newcumer was enrolled on the 22^d day of Aug, 1864, at Spring Grove Wis in Co. —, 38th Regiment of Wis Volunteers, to serve one year or during the war, and mustered into service as a priv on the 5th day of Sept 1864, at Madison Wis, in Co. —, 38th Regiment of Wis Volunteers, to serve one year or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. E of that Regiment, for the months of Jan & Feb 1865, he is reported "Died in 1st Div. 9th A.C. Hosp of Typhoid Fever Jan 13. 1865"
