

Declaration of a Widow for Restoration of Pension.

(Act of March 3, 1901, Amending Section 4708, Revised Statutes.)

On this 23rd day of Sept., A. D. one thousand nine hundred and one...
personally appeared before me, a Notary Public..... within and for the county and
State aforesaid Lucinda Kline....., aged 70 years,
a resident of Spring Grove....., County of Green.....,
State of Wis..... who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration
for the purpose of having her name restored to the pension roll under the act of March 3, 1901, amending
section 4708, Revised Statutes:

That she was formerly pensioned as widow of George Newcomer,
who died, 18...., by reason of wound or injury received or disease contracted
while serving as Private..... in Company E. 3rd Reg. Wis. Inf. in the war of
(State rank and designation of organization or name of vessel.)
the Rebellion..... That she was his lawful wife during the period of his service in said war, and
(Name the war in which he served.)
that she remained his lawful wife to the date of his death.

That her pension was paid by the United States pension agent at Milwaukee
and that the number of her pension certificate was..... That she never received any other pension
from the United States nor made any other application for pension.
(If she was ever pensioned or made a claim
for pension on account of any other soldier, his name, service, and relationship should be stated.)

That her pension terminated because of her marriage to William Kline.....
That said marriage took place Dec. 26., 1871., at Oakley Wis.....
That said husband died November 6., 1895., at Spring Grove Wis.....
(or) That she was divorced from said husband, upon her own application and without fault on her part,
on the..... day of..... 18...., at..... That said
husband did not serve in the Army or Navy of the United States.

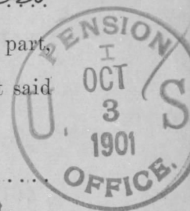
(A full statement of his service, if any, should be given.)
That she did not marry again after the death of the soldier except to William Kline
named above
(If she contracted any other marriage after the death of the soldier, the name of the husband, the date and place of
the marriage, and the date and manner of dissolution of the marriage should be stated.)

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding
two hundred and fifty dollars per year.

That she hereby appoints the adjutant general of Wisconsin, Madison, Dane county, Wisconsin, her
attorney to prosecute her claim.

this claim.

thority and signature are duly certified, and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the
prosecution of the claim.
