CHAPTER 47—REVISED STATUTES.

SECTION 1024. Every physician or surgeon, who shall be in attendance professionally at the time of the death of any person, shall at once make a record of such death in a book therefor, which record shall, so far as can be ascertained, contain the full name, sex, color, age, occupation, place of birth, name of parents, time and place of death, and the disease or cause of death, and, if within his knowledge, the name of the burial ground in which interred, and if married at the time of such death, the name of the husband or wife, and shall, within thirty days after such death, return the same facts in the form of a certificate, duly dated and signed by him, to the register of deeds of the county in which such death shall have occurred.

SECTION 1028. Every physician, or surgeon, or other professional person who shall be present professionally at any death, who shall neglect to make and return any certificate required to be made by section 1024, shall for every such neglect forfeit not less than fifty, nor more than one hundred dollars.

CHAPTER 287—LAWS 1882.

SECTION 1. Every physician, surgeon, or other professional person who shall comply with the provisions of section 1024 of the revised statutes, shall receive for each certificate returned to the register of deeds and certified to as provided in said section, the sum of fifteen cents, to be audited and paid out of the county treasury, on an itemized account verified by his oath.

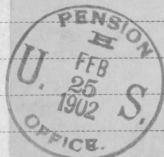
