On this 31<sup>st</sup> day of December A. D. 1853, personally appeared before the undersigned a Justice of the Court of Sessions of Oneida and for the county and state aforesaid Hannah Warren - aged Seventy four - years, a resident of the town of Augusta in the county of Oneida - and state of New York who being duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress approved the 3d day of February, 1853:

Who says that she is the widow of Daniel Warren deceased, who was a private in the war of the Revolution, and was pensioned under the act of 7 June 1832 at the rate of \$ 20 per annum, and was paid at the Albany Agency.

She further declares that she was married to the said Daniel Warren on or about the 26<sup>th</sup> day of January 1812 in the town of Augusta - in the county of Oneida - in the state of New York. That she was not married to him prior to January 1800 but that it took place at the time above stated, and that there is neither public or private record of their marriage within her knowledge -

She further declares that her husband, the aforesaid Daniel Warren died in the town of Augusta in the county of Oneida and state of New York

on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of June 1845

She further declares that she was a widow at the passage of the act, and is still a widow, and that she has never before made application for a pension.

Carran a Justice of the Peace in and for the County and State aforesaid Hannah Warren aged 76 years, a Resident of Augusta in the County of Oneida and State of New York Who being duly sworn, according to law, declares that she is the widow of Daniel Warren deceased, who was a private in the War of the Revolution, and was Pensioned under the act of June 1832 at the rate of \$ 20 per annum, and that she has been Pensioned under the act of February 3 1853 at the rate of \$ 20 per annum, as the widow of the said Daniel Warren deceased.

She further declares that she was married to the said Daniel Warren in Augusta in the County of Oneida and State of New York on the 26 day of January 1812  
She further declares that her husband, the aforesaid Daniel Warren died in Augusta in the County of Oneida and State of New York on the 22<sup>d</sup> of June 1845 and that she is still a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which she may be entitled under the act of March 3 1855.

## Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress  
of the 7<sup>th</sup> of June 1832.

State of New York

Oneida County ss. On this twenty third day of  
August one thousand eight hundred and thirty two  
personally appeared before <sup>me</sup> Nathan Kimball one  
of the associate judges of the court of common pleas  
of the county of Oneida Daniel Warren who by  
reason of bodily infirmity is unable to appear before  
the court and who is a resident of the town of Augusta  
in the county of Oneida & State of New York aged  
seventy eight years the twenty third day of February  
last past, who being first duly sworn, according  
to law doth on his oath make the following  
declaration in order to obtain the benefit of  
the provision made by the act of Congress  
passed June 7. 1832. That he entered in the  
army of the United States in the year one  
thousand seven hundred & eighty as a private

for six months with one Waters rank not  
recollected on the sixth day of July and served  
in Graton's regiment (number not recollected) in  
the Massachusetts line under the following  
named officers, Colonel Graton, Major Owen  
who also commanded the company to which  
he belonged. Lieutenant and Ensign not recollected.  
General Simons Brigade. During his term of  
enlistment he was transferred to the light infantry  
and served under the following named officers,  
Colonel Shepard, adjutant, Lieut. Captain, Major  
& Lieutenant not recollected, Ensign, Willington  
Col. Shepard commanded the brigade. After  
having served six months he was discharged  
at West point on the sixth of January one  
thousand seven hundred eighty one. He resided  
in the town of Northfield Hampshire county  
and state of Massachusetts when he entered the  
service. He was in no battles. He marched from  
Northfield to Old or South Hadley where he
