Dallas Ga. May 28, 64, paroled at Savannah Ga. Nov
19, 64; Reported at Camp Parole Md., Nov 26, 64, fur-
longued Dec 4, 64, for 30 days: to report to Camp Chase Ohio,
where he arrived Jan 11, 65. sent to Prov Mar Col Ohio, Jan 13, 65.
No evidence of disability on said records. Name not borne
on records of Andersonville Ga. on file.

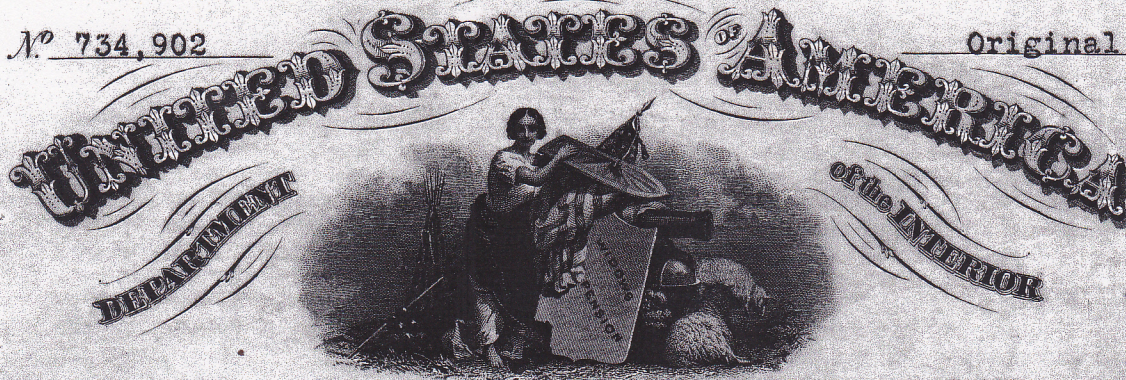
