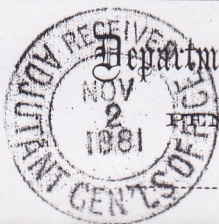

On this 12th day of April 1880, personally appeared before me a ^{deputy} clerk of the circuit Court, a court of record within and for the county and state aforesaid Orange A. Beach, who being duly sworn according to law says, that he is the identical Orange A. Beach who enlisted under the name of Orange A. Beach in the military service of the United States at Chenango County, in the State of New York on the 8th day of September 1864 in Capt. Franklin Bowers' Company C. 90th Regiment of New York Infantry in the war of the rebellion and was honorably discharged on the 30th day of May 1865 at Wilmington in the State of Delaware, that his personal description is as follows: age 43 years, height five feet, nine inches, complexion fair, hair brown, eyes blue.

That while in the service aforesaid and in the line of his duty, he contracted the following disability: that by reason of exposure to rain and damp ground while his company were guarding Gunpowder Ridge, he contracted the disease of Rheumatism. That on the 26th day of

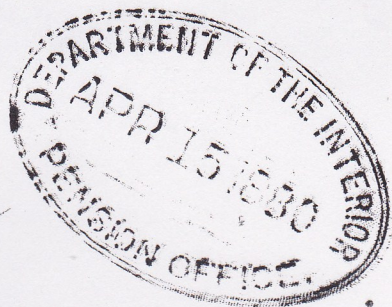

of April 1865, he was taken to the General Hospital at Wilmington, Delaware and was there treated for rheumatism until his discharge on May 30th 1865

That prior to his admission into the general hospital aforesaid he was treated by his regimental surgeon in the camp.

That prior to his enlistment into the service above named, this applicant was a man of good sound physical health, being when enrolled a blacksmith. That he is now partially disabled from obtaining his subsistence by manual labor, by reason of his injuries above described received in the service of the United States.

That since leaving the service this applicant has resided in Chenango County New York till May 1877 and at Windsor and Burke in Dane County, Wisconsin since May 1877 and his occupation has been that of a blacksmith and farmer.
