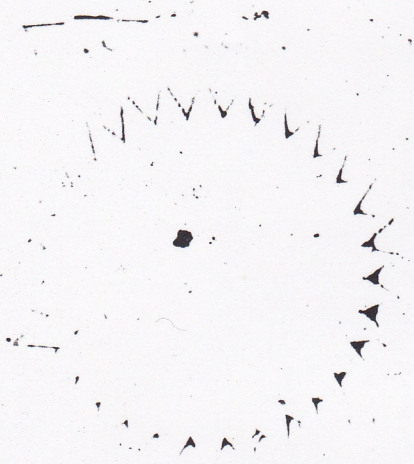

Personally appeared before me the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace for the County of New Haven, Timothy Barker who being duly sworn, deposed and saith, that, by reason of old age, and the consequent loss of memory, he cannot swear positively as to the precise length of his service; but according to the best of his recollection, he served not less than the periods below mentioned, and in the following grade -

In 1775, for nine months, and
in 1778, for six months - in the whole, for fifteen months; I served as a private; and for such service I claim a pension.

fortnight, and then enlisted into the Company under Col. Edward Ripel, Smd. Baldwin Lieut. He went to Long Island, and was there when we retreated under Genl. Washington. The Lieut. gave him charge of the boats, as the Lieut. knew nothing about it. was discharged Christmas day. He cannot state how long he served, but supposes about 6 months. Pay 40 shilling a month.

He was born in Branford, in Connecticut, the 5th (16th) of April 1750. His age is recorded on the records of said Branford, agreeable to the certificate hereto annexed.

Has lived in said Branford from a child.

He never had any written discharge, and has no documentary evidence.

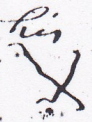
Merion Hobart was with me in the Campaign on Lake Champlain - and Herman Rogers in that on Long Island. Timothy P. Gilder, Clergyman and Timothy Johnson, residents of said Branford, will attest to my veracity and their belief of my services.

Declarant also served about 7 months as guard in Branford, but cannot remember his Officers, & cannot at present furnish full proof.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, & declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State.
